Assignment:

You will respond to the novels in the form of a reader's response journal. Write about your reaction, connection, reflection of the text *while you read*. Do NOT wait until you have finished the book to write the journal; you should record your thoughts as you go.

Length requirement: Typed (3 pages double-spaced, 12 pt. font – for each book = 9 pages total) **OR** Hand-written (3 pages single-spaced, no wasted space = 9 pages total.

I am looking for your reaction to the work as you read. You are **NOT** retelling the plot. Some things you might think about as you respond to the text:

- Make connections to other works of literature
- Relate to any characters or situations
- Analyze the character's emotions or motivation
- Consider themes or symbols; consider how the setting affects the plot
